WISCONSIN COUNTY, DISTRICT, & STATE FAIRS 2017 ANIMAL HEALTH RULES & REQUIREMENTS SUMMARY

If a fair or livestock exhibition lasts more than 24 hours the sponsors must appoint a licensed Veterinarian to conduct a daily inspection of all livestock at the fair or exhibition. The Veterinarian shall review all records and test results required under ATCP 10.87. If a fair or exhibition lasts less than 24 hours, all records or test results required by ATCP 10.87 shall be reviewed by a licensed Veterinarian or by the show chairperson. Records shall include exhibitors name and address, identification of animals exhibited including number, type and description, documentation to show compliance with disease testing and other health requirements, and the livestock premise code, if any, of the premises from which the animals originate. Fair management must maintain these records for 5 years.

This is a summary of DATCP animal health requirements for exhibition only. These requirements may change due to animal disease emergencies in Wisconsin or other states. It is always advisable to check with the Wisconsin Division of Animal Health website or call (608-224-4872) for the most recent health requirements when planning to exhibit animals. Animals meeting exhibition requirements may not meet all import or movement requirements for other purposes. The fair and WDATCP have the right to make such tests and

examinations as may be necessary to determine the disease status of any animal exhibited.

Animals that show evidence of having contagious or infectious diseases may not be commingled (housed/kept) with other animals at the fair, show or other exposition in such a way as to allow disease to spread. Such animals should not attend the fair, show, or exposition. Animals may be denied entry if they arrive at these events with contagious or infectious diseases, isolated and/or removed if they develop disease after arriving, or be subject to other action as would be necessary to control disease such as removed immediately, quarantined or slaughtered.

Cattle affected with ringworm, warts, mange or scab may not be exhibited, unless the veterinarian in charge determines the ringworm lesions or warts are inactive and incapable of transmitting the disease. Any cattle found with ringworm, warts, mange or scab that are active shall be removed from the premises of the fair.

CATTLE AND BISON

Cattle originating from within Wisconsin

There are no test or health document requirements for Wisconsin cattle. However, fair management is responsible for maintaining records of persons who have exhibited at the fair, the livestock premises code, if any, and the identification of animals shown for 5 years. Acceptable forms of animal identification for breeding animals are (1) an official metal ear tag, (2) a breed registration number, or (3) a breed registration tattoo, (4) other identification approved by the department or regular ear tag. For steers, either an official ear tag or the identification applied at weigh-in may be used. Entry blanks submitted and signed by exhibitors, including one of the forms of identification listed above will fulfill the exhibitor requirements. The fair's records of animals shown and exhibited are to be retained in case these are needed for disease tracing purposes.

Cattle originating from outside Wisconsin

A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection shall accompany all cattle documenting animal identification (see above) and all tests or certifications required. Animals must have at least one form of official individual ID (including steers). Animals must meet normal Wisconsin requirements for interstate movement. The Wisconsin Division of Animal Health website has current import requirements. Acceptable animal IDs for all cattle from outside Wisconsin are official USDA metal ear tags (NUES) and AIN 15-digit “840” tags. Manufacturer-coded RFID tag—15-digit number with first three digits in 900s or American ID tag—8 to 12-digit number prefaced with “USA” are valid only if applied before March 11, 2015.

No cattle from outside Wisconsin are currently required to be brucellosis-tested or vaccinated to come to fairs and shows in Wisconsin.

Tuberculosis requirements for cattle from outside Wisconsin:

Cattle originating from Michigan's TB Free Zone

See requirements by state as above.

Cattle originating from **Michigan's MA and MAA zones** also need 1) Import permit, 2) To originate from a herd that has a negative whole-herd TB test within 12 months before arrival in Wisconsin that includes all animals 1 year and older, 3) Negative individual TB test within 60 days before entering Wisconsin and 4) To return directly to the state of origin after the show, and there must be a statement on the CVI that they will be doing so.

Cattle from Canada may be exhibited in Wisconsin if they meet current federal requirements to cross the international border.

SWINE

Swine originating from within Wisconsin

All swine shall be accompanied by a Wisconsin Intrastate Movement Certificate stating that the herd of origin has been inspected on the farm within 30 days prior to the exhibition and showed no signs of disease. The certificate must also include all required test documentation.

Swine originating from outside Wisconsin

All swine need a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection that includes the following: a statement of the PEDv status of the herd of origin (if known), a statement of the PRRS status of the herd of origin, a statement that the veterinarian has inspected the entire herd of origin within the past 30 days and that not apparent disease was present at the time of inspection, contain all required test documentation and official identification number with complete physical destination address. Acceptable IDs include: USDA silver ear tag, USDA 840 button ear tag, breed association tattoo, ear tag with premise ID number and unique identifier and ear notch (if the pig is a purebred and the notch is registered).

SHEEP

Sheep originating from within Wisconsin

Sexually-intact sheep of any age and all other sheep 12 months of age and older need an official individual ID. Official ID may be scrapie ear tags or tattoos, USDA 840 button ear tag, approved microchips if a reader is available and if accompanied by registration papers or breed association tattoo (as long as it is unique to that animal). Sheep cannot be under restriction for movement to fairs and shows. Sheep cannot have been exposed to scrapie if they are sexually intact.

Sheep originating from outside Wisconsin

All sheep need a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection with an official individual ID. Per federal rule, the CVI must include a statement that the animals were not exhibiting clinical signs of scrapies and an owner statement to whether the animal is or is not a scrapie-positive, suspect, high risk or exposed animal and whether it originated in an infected, source, exposed or noncompliant flock. Official individual IDs include scrapie ear tags or tattoos, USDA 840 button ear tags, approved microchips if a reader is available or breed association tattoo if accompanied by registration papers in the owner's name. Sheep cannot have been exposed to scrapie.

GOATS

Goats originating from within Wisconsin

. Sexually-intact goats of any age and all other goats 12 months of age and older need an official individual ID. Official ID may be scrapie ear tags or tattoos, USDA 840 button ear tag, approved microchips if a reader is available and accompanied by registration papers or breed association tattoo if accompanied with registration papers in the owner's name. Goats cannot have been exposed to scrapie if they are sexually intact.

Goats originating from outside Wisconsin

All goats need a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection with an official individual ID. . Per federal rule, the CVI must include a statement that the animals were not exhibiting clinical signs of scrapies and an owner statement pertaining to the status of the animals or herd in regards to scrapies. Official individual IDs include scrapie ear tags or tattoos, USDA 840 button ear tags, approved microchips if a reader is available and accompanied with registration papers or breed association tattoo if accompanied by registration papers in the owner's name. Goats cannot have been exposed to scrapie.

Goats from Michigan's TB Modified Accredited Zone need import permits. Negative whole-herd TB tests within 12 months before entering Wisconsin are needed. Goats also need negative individual TB tests within 60 days before entering. Goats must return directly to the state of origin after the show.

EQUINE

Equine animals originating from within Wisconsin

All equine animals shall be accompanied by documentation of a negative Equine infectious Anemia (EIA) test conducted within the previous 12 months which clearly identifies the equine by a registration number, digital photographs, an approve microchip (if reader is available) or a complete description of the equine. Documentation forms include official test report VS 10-11, USDA-approved electronic test form, Global Vet Link EIA electronic form or CVI with test results listed.

Equine animals originating from outside Wisconsin

All equine animals shall be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and have been tested negative for equine infectious anemia (EIA) test conducted within the previous 12 months. The Certificate must clearly identify the equine by a registration number, digital photographs, an approved microchip or a complete description of the equine animal.

Equines from Minnesota are exempt from the CVI requirement if ownership does not change while the animal is in Wisconsin, the animal remains in Wisconsin no longer than 7 days and proof of a current negative EIA test accompanies the animal.

SOUTH AMERICAN CAMELIDS: llamas, alpacas, guanacos, vicunas

South American camelids originating from within Wisconsin

There are no requirements.

South American camelids originating from outside Wisconsin

All South American camelids must be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection with official individual identification. Official IDs may be approved USDA ear tag number, microchip number, breed association registration number or breed association tattoo.

EXOTIC RUMINANTS (ruminants that are not native to Wisconsin and are not cervids)

Exotic ruminants from within Wisconsin

There are no requirements.

Exotic ruminants from outside Wisconsin

Exotic ruminants are required to have a written import permit and CVI with proof of negative Tuberculosis (within 60 days) and negative Brucellosis (within 30 days) tests. They need official animal ID as listed: Approved USDA ear tag number, Microchip number, Breed association registration number or tattoo.

Call in advance of the exhibition to the Division of Animal Health (608-224-4872) for testing requirements.

POULTRY

Poultry and waterfowl from within Wisconsin

Need: A NPIP certificate stating that the birds originate from a US pullorum-typhoid clean or NPIP affiliate flock and turkeys must test negative for Mycoplasma gallisepticum or a DATCP-issued certificate stating they are from a Wisconsin Tested or Affiliate Flock and turkeys must test negative for Mycoplasma gallisepticum. Or individually test sexually mature birds within 90 days before arrival at the show. All birds must

test negative for pullorum-typhoid and turkeys must test negative for Mycoplasma gallisepticum.

These birds need wing or leg band IDs.

Poultry and waterfowl from outside Wisconsin

Need a certificate of veterinary inspection or equivalent (such as form VS 9-3) that states:

They originate from a flock classified pullorum-typhoid clean under NPIP or an equivalent state program and turkeys must test negative for Mycoplasma gallisepticum or if sexually mature, that they have tested negative for pullorum-typhoid (and Mycoplasma gallisepticum for turkeys) within 90 days before arrival at the show. These birds also need wing or leg band IDs.

CERVIDAE

For regulations for exhibition, contact DATCP-Animal Health at 608-224-4872.

DOGS, DOMESTIC CATS & other HOUSEHOLD PETS (ferrets, pet birds, rabbits, gerbils, guinea pigs, hamsters, domestic mice and rats)

Dogs and cats originating from within Wisconsin Small animals from within Wisconsin

Dogs over 5 months of age must have proof of current rabies vaccination.

Cats and other household pets have no requirements.

Dogs and cats originating from outside Wisconsin

All dogs and domestic cats shall be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection including the age of the animal and have proof of a current rabies vaccination if are 5 months or older. See ATCP 10.80 for specific vaccination information.

Other household pets from outside Wisconsin

Need certificates of veterinary inspection, but have no testing or vaccination requirements.

EXOTIC SMALL ANIMALS (NOT INCLUDED ABOVE, EXOTIC LARGE ANIMALS AND OTHER WILD ANIMALS)

Animals from within Wisconsin do not have any requirements as long as they are legally possessed in Wisconsin.

Animals from outside Wisconsin generally have no testing or vaccination requirements, but do need a certificate of veterinary inspection and import permit number.

Note: Some animals may not be brought to Wisconsin. These are North American prairie dogs and the following African species: tree squirrels, rope squirrels, dormice, Gambian giant pouched rats, brush-tailed porcupines, and striped mice.

Others may require permits from the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources.

CIRCUS, RODEO, RACING AND MENAGERIE ANIMALS

All shall have a permit from the Department, and shall be isolated from all non-circus, non-rodeo, and non-menagerie animals at the exhibition. They must meet current import requirements.

Animals from within Wisconsin must meet vaccination and testing requirements for their species.

Animals from outside Wisconsin need certificates of veterinary inspection and vaccination and tests required for their species. They also need import permit numbers if they are: 1) Circus and individual circus acts, 2) rodeo stock other than individual participants' horses, 3) multi-species menageries, or 4) petting zoos. Phone 608/224-4872 for a permit application.

Fair managers: Please note that this requirement applies to all animals belonging to midway attractions and rodeos.

ADVISORY FOR HOUSING NON-TRADITIONAL LIVESTOCK AND FOR MANAGEMENT OF OTHER ANIMALS WHILE THE FAIR IS UNDERWAY:

The Department makes the following recommendations, but these are not required by statute or administrative rule:

1. South American camelids (llamas, vicunas, alpacas, and guanacos) and other exotic ruminants not be housed with domestic cattle.
2. Ratites (ostriches, emus, rheas, and cassowaries) should not be housed with domestic poultry.
3. Swine should not be housed with other mammalian species.
4. Bovine viral diarrhea (BVD) is an infectious disease of cattle that can spread rapidly under the conditions of a livestock show. The Department strongly recommends that all breeding cattle exhibited at Wisconsin fairs be properly vaccinated against BVD at least 30 days prior to the show. Exhibitors should consult with their veterinarians regarding the proper choice of vaccine and the correct schedule for its administration.
5. Recommend that cattle be test negative for BVD-PI by immunoperoxidase test and negative for Johnes disease by the ELISA test.
6. Prohibit the use of common watering and feeding troughs.
7. Recommend all vehicles and equipment used to transport animals to and from the exhibition or used at the exhibition be cleaned and disinfected prior to and after use for this purpose.
8. Require all animals found to be afflicted with a contagious or infectious disease to be promptly removed from the premises.
9. Provide hand wash stations near all livestock facilities.
10. Recommend that all fairs add a space on livestock entry forms for the premises registration code.
11. Isolate exhibited animals returning to their farms or animals purchased at the show for 21 days before

mingling them with other stock.

12. House cattle separately from small ruminants, especially sheep.

Need not to be a resident of Columbia County to enter in any Depts. ENTRIES ACCEPTED MAY 1 THROUGH JUNE 20.

ENTRY DEADLINE: ALL entries must be delivered or postmarked on or before June 20th of the current fair year NO EXCEPTIONS. Entry forms can be turned in any time after May 1st. You don't have to wait until June 20th

- THERE IS A \$2 ENTRY FEE PER OPEN CLASS EXHIBITOR PAYABLE BY EXHIBITOR ON ENTRY DAY OR WHEN ENTRY TAGS ARE PICKED UP OR FEES COULD BE SENT TO COLUMBIA COUNTY FAIR, PO BOX 57, PORTAGE.

- IN ORDER TO BE A VALID ENTRY, FEES NEED TO BE PAID PRIOR TO ENTRY AND JUDGING AT THE FAIR. INVALID ENTRIES DO NOT RECEIVE PREMIUMS.

EXHIBIT ENTRY DAY: Tuesday, 2:00 – 7:00 p.m.

- Applications for entry must be on printed forms from this book, or obtained from the Fair Secretary. These forms must be properly filled out and signed by the exhibitor. They must be received or postmarked by June 20th.

- NO ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER THE DEADLINE.

- ANY ANIMAL ON THE FAIRGROUNDS MUST BE IDENTIFIED IN THEIR RESPECTIVE SPECIES TO MAINTAIN RECORDS FOR 5 YEARS.

- Positively NO livestock unloaded from the vehicles until applications and health certificates have been checked.

- VIOLATORS WILL BE BANNED FROM EXHIBITING.

- No bedding or hay will be furnished.

- ONLY ONE ENTRY PER LOT NUMBER IS ALLOWED BY AN EXHIBITOR WITH THE EXCEPTION THAT AN EXHIBITOR CAN ENTER TWO (2) ENTRIES PER INDIVIDUAL ANIMAL LOTS AND ONE (1) ENTRY PER GROUP ANIMAL LOT IN OPEN GOAT AND THREE (3) ENTRIES PER LOT IN OPEN POULTRY.

All cattle entered for premiums shall be recorded in the proper or respective herd books of America and Certificate of registry must be displayed to Superintendent or Judge.

No animal exhibited in the Junior Fair class will be eligible for competition in the Open Class. Except in group classes when they are NOT offered in the Junior Classes. Junior dairy entries can also be for Open Class.

Exhibits must be in place by 7:00 p.m. on entry day (Tuesday) and cannot be removed before 4:00 p.m. of the last day of the fair (Sunday).

A SPRING CALF is one born on or after March 1, 2017.

A WINTER CALF is one whose date of birth is between December 1, 2016 and February 28, 2017.

A FALL CALF is one whose date of birth is between September 1, 2016 and November 30, 2016.

A SUMMER YEARLING is one whose date of birth is between June 1, 2016 and August 31, 2016.

A SPRING YEARLING is one whose date of birth is between March 1, 2016 and May 31, 2016.

A WINTER YEARLING is one whose date of birth is between December 1, 2015 and February 29, 2016.

A FALL YEARLING is one whose date of birth is between September 1, 2015 and November 30, 2015.

A 2 YEAR-OLD is one born between September 1, 2014 and August 31, 2015. A 2-year-old includes a yearling that has freshened.

A 3 YEAR-OLD is one whose date of birth is between September 1, 2013 and August 31, 2014.

A 4 YEAR-OLD is one whose date of birth is between September 1, 2012 and August 31, 2013.

A DRY COW is one not less than 3 years old which is not currently lactating, but has milked 280 days or more since the last fair season.

All dairy cattle must be registered.

- All animals need to have an ID.
- All cows competing shall be thoroughly milked out to the satisfaction of the superintendent at milking time.
- **All spring calves must be born before April 1, 2017 to show at the fair.**
- Not more than one prize shall be awarded to an exhibitor under any one entry number in this classification.

- Open Dairy will show with Junior Dairy on Friday morning.

DAIRY AND BEEF

A DAIRY JUNIOR GET OF SIRE shall consist of 3 animals which are the offspring of the same bull. All of these animals shall be under 2 years of age, and not more than one may be a bull.

A BEEF JUNIOR GET OF SIRE shall consist of 3 animals which are the offspring of the same bull and are animals in the junior calf, senior calf, and/or the summer yearling, bull and heifer classes, with both sexes to be represented.

A DAIRY AND BEEF SENIOR GET OF SIRE shall consist of 3 animals which are the offspring of one sire. All of these animals shall be 2 years of age or over. In either a dairy or beef breed get of sire, the name of the sire shall be designated by the exhibitor. The animals need not be owned by a single exhibitor.

A PRODUCE OF DAM shall consist of 2 animals of any age or sex which are the produce of one cow.

A GROUP OF 3 BEST FEMALE CATTLE shall consist of 3 animals of any age which were bred and are owned by the exhibitor.

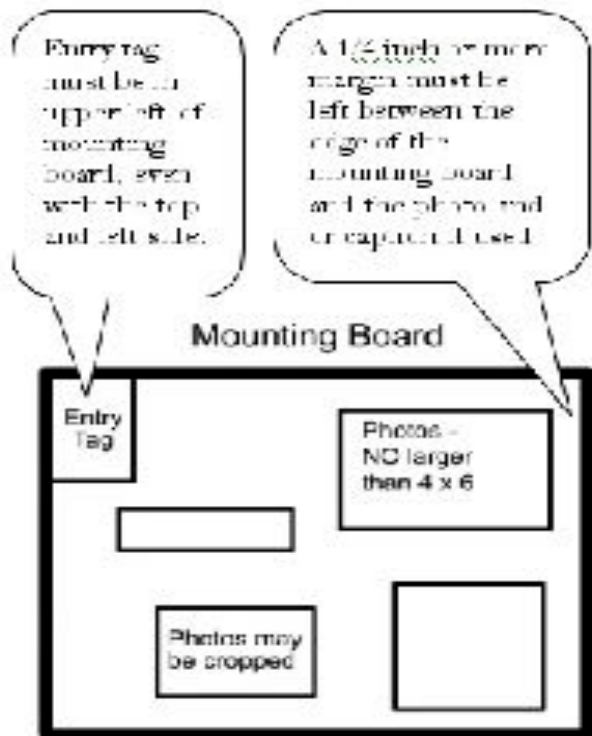

COUNTY AND DISTRICT FAIR REGULATIONS

1996 CHAPTER ATCP 160

ATCP 160.01 DEFINITIONS. As used in this chapter:

(1) "Class" means a grouping in which exhibits may be entered, including an animal breed or age group for animal exhibits; a type of produce, crop or food; or a specific age, age group or educational level of exhibitor.

(2) "Department" as it relates to the organizational structure of a fair, means as animal species, production group, or other principal classification of exhibits. As used in any other context, "department" means the state of Wisconsin department of agriculture, trade and consumer protection.

(3) "Division means one of 3 exhibitor group classifications for a fair and is limited to junior division, open division and senior citizens division.

(4) "Lot" or "lot number" means the numerical designation assigned by a local fair for a specific category of exhibits within a class.

(5) "Premium" means a monetary prize that a county or district fair awards to an exhibitor after judging all competing exhibits in the class to which the premium pertains.

ATCP 160.02 PREMIUM REQUIREMENTS (1) General.

(a) The state aid authorized by s. 93.23 (1), Stats. may be paid only on net premiums, which consist of total premiums paid less total entry fees received. The department may withhold state premium aid from any fair which does not enforce the animal health provisions required under ch. ATCP 10 for all classes of livestock exhibited at the fair. State aid will be paid only on premiums actually paid by bank check or draft.

(b) No deductions may be made from premium money won by an exhibitor. Premiums may, however, may be withheld where exhibition rules established by the fair association are violated. A written statement of violation shall be submitted to the department to justify action taken by local fair.

(c) Premiums offered shall be definite in amount. No decrease or increase in published premiums may be made because of the financial condition of the organization, or for any other reason.

(d) State aid may be paid on no more than 2 premiums awarded an exhibitor under one premium or lot number in open division individual livestock classes, except poultry and rabbits, and no more than one premium in all other classes, including poultry and rabbits.

(e) No county or district fair may receive state aid for a premium awarded to any exhibitor in the open division if that exhibitor entered the same exhibit in the junior division at the same county or district fair. This

paragraph does not apply if the exhibit was entered in the junior division only as part of a herd group, carcass class or performance class.

(f) No state aid will be paid on the cost of ribbons, cups, trophy prizes or entertainment contests.

(2) PREMIUM LISTS. (a) Premiums for which state aid is requested by county and district fairs shall conform with the uniform premium list and other requirements set forth in these rules. Fairs requesting state aid for net premiums shall submit to the department a printed copy of the premium list used at the fair, as required under ATCP 160.92 (3) (d).

(b) The officers of each fair shall mail a copy of the premium list to other associations, societies, or boards conducting a fair in Wisconsin upon request.

(c) Sections ATCP 160.01 through 160.07 and 160.91 shall be published in premium books used by a fair for which state aid is requested.

(3) ENTRY FEES. (a) A county or district fair may charge an exhibitor an entry fee. The entry fee may not exceed 10% of the sum of all premiums offered to exhibitors in the same class for which the entry fee is charged. In lieu of an entry fee, a county or district fair may charge stall rents for horses, cattle, sheep, goats, swine, poultry, rabbits or pets. Stall rents shall not exceed \$1.50 per single stall or animal or \$3.00 per box stall for horses: \$1.00 per single stall or animal or \$2.00 per box for cattle; or \$0.50 per animal or \$2.00 per pen for swine, goats or sheep. A standard pen for swine, goats or sheep is approximately 64 square feet. Cage rents may not exceed \$0.50 per head for poultry, rabbit or pet exhibits.

(b) Exhibitors in educational and school departments shall not be required to purchase an exhibitor's ticket. Any other exhibitor may be required, if no entry fee is charged, to purchase an exhibitor's season ticket at a price not to exceed that charged for a non-exhibitor's season ticket.

(4) SPLIT FAIR DATES No state aid may be paid to fairs having split dates, unless prior written approval is granted by the department. Extreme hardship must be established by the fair organization before approval can be granted. A split date is one where exhibits or contests are judged, and premiums paid at more than one time or at more than one location during the current year. When split dates are approved, all blue ribbon winners shall be required to repeat their demonstration of exhibit at the regular fair dates, unless exempted by the department in hardship cases. The repeated demonstration or exhibit may be presented through the use of audio-visual media, still photography or an educational display. Split date approval may not be required for clothing revue, demonstration, favorite foods revue or dogs and small animals.

ATCP 160.03 EXHIBITION REQUIREMENTS. A county or district fair shall meet all the exhibition requirements of this section to be eligible for state premium aid.

(1) No fair society or other organization sponsoring a county or district fair shall require an exhibitor to become a member of the organization in order to enter an exhibit at the fair, nor shall the sponsoring organization make any deduction from an exhibitor's premium as a donation to the fair society, or require an exhibitor in any other way to make a donation to the

society.

(2) State aid may not be approved for out-of-state exhibits or for separate classes of local and non-local exhibitors. Aid may not be approved for payment of premiums to an exhibitor having an out-of-state address but claiming Wisconsin residency unless the fair secretary provides the department with an affidavit that the exhibitor's residence is geographically located within the state.

(3) State aid may be paid only on articles or animals actually on display in an exhibit building or actually shown in the show ring on regular fair dates unless approval for split dates is obtained under s. ATCP 160.02 (4). State aid may not be paid on Dairy Herd Improvement Association records, transportation aid, production contests or other special exhibits unless prior approval is obtained under s. ATCP 160.04 (8).

(4) State aid may not be paid on exhibits removed from the fair grounds before 4 p.m. of the last day of the fair, or such other later time as may be specified by the fair, without prior approval of the department. Authority for earlier removal may be granted by the department in case of meat sales, or other special classes, if requested before the beginning of the fair. In other hardship cases, approval may be granted by the local fair. Exhibits in dog obedience and small animal pet classes may be judged during the regular fair but are not required to remain present during the entire fair. The local fair may prescribe the length of time junior fair exhibitors of horses shall keep their animals on the grounds.

ATCP 160.04 JUNIOR FAIR DIVISION; General requirements.

(1) ELIGIBILITY. In the junior fair division, the department may pay state aid on prizes offered to exhibitors who are under 20 years of age on January 1 of the current fair year. A county or district fair board may establish subgroups within a junior fair entry class based on the exhibitor's grade level in school. The department may not pay state aid on prizes for club parades, cub floats, song contests, or a project which is not an exhibit or demonstration at the fair.

(2) All exhibitors in the junior fair division shall be members of 4-H, FFA, FHA - HERO, Scouting programs, breed groups, or any other recognized youth organization under adult leadership and with an education program approved by the local fair.

(3) Exhibits in the junior fair shall be the result of the exhibitor's own labor and may include a study, merit, or other special project, a skill area or a supervised occupational experience in which the exhibitor is regularly enrolled.

(4) State aid may be used for the payment of no more than one premium awarded an exhibitor under any one premium or lot number in the junior fair division, except when awarded as part of a group in livestock exhibits or in showmanship.

(5) Premiums in the educational department shall be paid directly to the exhibitor who made the exhibit and not to the school or teacher, except for group premiums offered to inter-school competitive classes. No aid may be paid on educational department premiums unless a complete list of exhibitors and a complete set of judges' sheets for the education department, similar to those required in other

departments, is filed with the department. All educational exhibits shall be displayed at the fair regardless of whether they are judged prior to or at the fair.

(6) If 16 or more animals, items or articles are entered in any junior fair class, the class may be divided into 2 or more approximately equal groups according to weight, age, or other identifying characteristic and each group is judged as a class.

(7) Special education exhibits may (be) established if the proposal is presented to the Wisconsin Association of Fairs before October 1 of the year preceding its proposed establishment and the exhibit is approved by the department.

(8) Within any junior fair department under subch. IV, a county or district fair may establish special classes where none are specified under subch. IV. Special classes may include classes for grade and crossbred females in the beef, swine, sheep and horse departments. Premiums for special classes created under this subsection shall be equal to premiums for comparable classes established in the same department under subch. IV.

ATCP 160.05 OPEN DIVISION; General Requirements.

(1) The total maximum premiums set forth for all places in any open division livestock class, excluding poultry and rabbits, may be divided into premiums for a greater number of places, but the maximum premium offered for any additional place shall not be higher than the maximum for last place in the class.

(2) State aid for premiums awarded for horses in open division classes shall be limited to horses which are owned by the exhibitor.

(3) All animals in any open division class shall be owned by the exhibitor, except as provided in s. ATCP 160.09

ATCP 160.06 SENIOR CITIZENS DIVISION; General Requirements.

(1) The age of exhibitors in the senior citizens division is limited to persons 62 years of age or older.

(2) Exhibitors in the senior citizens division may not enter identical items or articles in both the senior citizens division and the corresponding classes of the regular open division.

ATCP 160.7 CLASSES; General Requirements

(1) Classes may be combined if the number of entries in several single classes is insufficient. If any classes are combined, state aid shall be limited to the maximum total premiums listed for a single class of animals, items, or articles in that department.

(2) (a) Except as provided under par. (b), no county or district fair may receive state aid for premiums awarded sexually intact male dairy cattle, beef cattle, sheep, goats, swine or horses unless those animals are registered purebreds. Registered purebred status shall be documented by a certificate of registry from the appropriate breed association or society, or by a copy of the application for registration.

(b) Paragraph (a) does not apply to dairy cattle exhibited at a county or district fair if a national breed association certifies that those cattle are recorded in that breed association's qualified herd book which

records the genealogy of that breed.

(3) Any animal entered as part of a group class may also be exhibited in a class for individual animals.

(4) Boars may not be entered as an exhibit in the swine department unless their tusks have been removed.

ATCP 160.91 JUDGING REGULATIONS

(1) Judging shall be done at county and district fairs by individuals who are registered with the department and who have knowledge, training or experience in the specific class or classes to be judged as determined by the department. Judging shall be done in accordance with the requirements of s. ATCP 160.92 (3) (a). In no case shall any person who is an officer or director of a fair be eligible to judge exhibits at such fair; nor shall any person interested directly or indirectly in exhibits shown in any department of a fair be eligible to judge articles or animals in that department.

(2) Each judge at a county or district fair shall be provided with a copy of the fair's premium book or list of entry classes as least 7 days prior to the opening date of the fair.

(3) No animal or article, irrespective of the number of entries in the class in which it is entered, shall be awarded a higher rating than its merit would entitle it to in comparison to the standard of perfection in the class.

(4) (a) No state aid will be paid on premiums awarded under the Danish system in any class except in the junior and educational departments.

(b) When classes in the junior and educational departments are judged according to the Danish system, 4 group placings shall be awarded in any class. When there are less than 8 exhibitors in the class, there shall not be more than 2 in the first group, not more than 4 in the first 2 groups and not more than 6 in the first 3 groups. If there are 8 or more entries in the class, there shall not be more than 25% in the first group, not more than 50% in the first 2 groups, and not more than 75% in the first three groups.

(c) The number of awards in the last group placing may be increased to the extent necessary to give awards to all exhibitors.

(5) If any class of exhibits at a county or district fair is judged according to the regular system, the judges for that class may give only one first-place, one second-place, one third-place and one fourth-place in that class.
